

Invitation: North Street Community Charrette

Help Shape the Future of North Street, Exeter

You are invited to take part in a collaborative community workshop exploring the future of North Street, Exeter. The workshop is organised by Exeter Civic Society, InExeter and Citizen Architects.

Building on earlier work with residents and local businesses to develop a shared Vision document for the street (read the 'Vision' document: <https://exetercivicsociety.org.uk/wp-content/uploads/2025/11/North-Street-Improvements-ECS-Workshop-2-Results-V4.pdf>), this charrette is an opportunity to take the next step and explore what real change could look like on the ground.

As North Street undergoes significant change, there is a rare opportunity to help shape how future investment and development contribute to the character, identity, and everyday life of Exeter. We want local voices, ideas, and experience to be part of that conversation.

The workshop will bring together residents, businesses, community organisations, designers, planners, transport specialists, and anyone interested in the future of the city.

Through discussion, sketching, mapping, and model making, we will explore questions such as:

- What should North Street feel like in the future?
- How can it become more welcoming, vibrant, and people focused?
- How can walking, cycling, and public transport work better together?
- How can future development create a place people genuinely value and enjoy?

No specialist experience is required, just an interest in Exeter and a willingness to share ideas.
